Amelanchier alnifolia



Smokey (10'-12' tall, upright)

Theissen (12'tall x 15' wide, upright)

Northline (9' tall and spreading)

Honeywood (12'tall and wide, vase shaped)

Features:

- Food - berries can be eaten fresh, dried, frozen, cooked, or juiced.
- Growing - Prune only dead, damaged or diseased stems within the first three years. Thereafter, prune to allow good light penetration and air movement, with the goal of replacing all the fruiting wood every 3-4 years. The best fruit production usually occurs on vigorous 2 to 4 year-old stems
